



**Tammy Roebuck** - As a teenager, Tammy envisioned a career in sports broadcasting, and reached out to Gayle Sierens, a legendary Tampa TV news anchor who was the first woman to serve in a play-by-play role for an NFL game on NBC in 1987. Gayle encouraged Tammy to apply for an internship program, which led to Tammy's introduction into broadcast television.

At the age of 19, Tammy became part of the first "radio with pictures" program in the country when she produced and directed the Ace award-winning program, *QZOO Tube*. Featured in the Broadcast Hall of Fame, *QZOO Tube* paved the way for radio shows to appear on television.

She continued her broadcasting debut by producing Tampa Bay Rowdies (Major League Soccer) games for Sports Channel Florida and as station manager, she developed hundreds of 30-minute television shows.

In 2002, Tammy was named senior producer of Hillsborough Television (HTV22). Under Tammy's guidance, HTV 22 was named the nation's Best Government Television Station in 2004. In 2009, she was part of a group of layoffs by Hillsborough County and seized the opportunity to create her own company, Bean Productions. The company serves more than 200 clients, including Ruth Eckerd Hall and Florida Cancer Specialists.

Tammy also collaborates with her husband, actor Daniel Roebuck, and has worked on several short and independent films with him. Their projects are produced under the name Magic Bean Entertainment. Their first feature film, *Getting Grace*, will hit theaters nationwide March 23<sup>rd</sup>. They are slated to begin principal filming of their next feature film *The Hail Mary* in the summer of 2018. **Victoria Jorgensen** - Writer, Director and Producer - Victoria Jorgensen is an award-winning Tampa Bay based filmmaker, writer and film festival organizer. She has attended the Berlin and Toronto Film Festivals annually since 1999 returning to Tampa Bay with programming suggestions for local area film festivals. Her films have shown at festivals around the world including a three woman show, *formato*, at Museuda Imagem R Do Som, in Sao Paulo, Brazil and Cannes Film Festival 2017.

Jorgensen attended Cannes Film Festival in May of 2017 with *Tiny Bacteria*, cowritten with writing partner Marina Shemwell and starring local actor Eugenie Bondurant (Tigris in *Hunger Games Mockingjay 2*).

**Renee Warmack** - Tampa native, Renee Warmack, is a producer, speaker and coach who creates positive change in the world through inspirational movies and events; motivational talks; and helping others claim their power and capture their dreams.

Warmack spent 20 years working in government programs and public administration and now focuses full time on her company Renee Warmack Productions, LLC. Her first documentary film, *Ten at the Top in Tampa Bay*, premiered on PBS and features women government leaders who broke the glass ceiling. Her second movie, *A Community with A Dream: The Founding of the Children's Board*, tells the story child advocates who lobbied Hillsborough County citizens to create a special taxing district for kids. The film aired on local government and public access channels. She's currently producing the Sam Piazza story, based on the life of a remarkable Gaither High School student with Down Syndrome who was crowned prom King by the student body. Warmack also collaborates on multi-media projects and women empowerment events with her spouse, Dr. Sandi Eveleth, a video editor and digital marketing strategist, who owns <u>KISSyourWeb.com</u>.
